During January, the UK was affected by Storm Goretti, which was issued with an amber weather warning, indicating a significant risk to life and property due to snow, ice, strong winds, and hazardous travel conditions.

Throughout this period, Wentworth Community Care acted promptly to ensure the safety of both clients and staff. Our contingency and business continuity plans were implemented where required, with clear prioritisation of high-risk clients and time-critical medication. Rotas were adjusted to minimise travel distances, and staff safety remained a key consideration in all decisions made.

Despite the challenges, care continued to be delivered safely where conditions allowed. This was made possible by the professionalism, flexibility, and teamwork shown by our staff, many of whom adapted at short notice and supported one another during difficult conditions.

We are proud of how the team responded during Storm Goretti. The way staff communicated, followed guidance, and put safety first reflects the values of Wentworth Community Care. Learning from this period will continue to strengthen our emergency planning and resilience moving forward.
